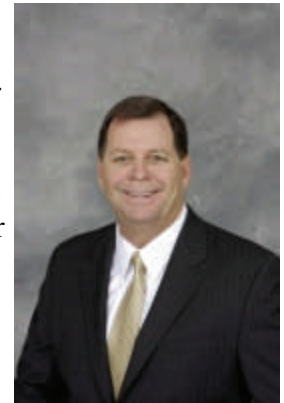




DYNAMIC TEAM TO LEAD FATHER LOPEZ INTO THE FUTURE

Bishop Thomas Wenski announces the appointment of Terry Mularkey as president and Ted Petrucciani as principal of Father Lopez Catholic High School, Daytona Beach effective for the upcoming 2010-2011 school year. The search for the team has been on-going since the president/principal model was adopted for all of the Diocese of Orlando high schools.

Mr. Mularkey returns to his home state after serving as Vice President of The Citadel Foundation in Charleston, SC, where he was responsible for managing and leading all fundraising activity raising more than \$20,000,000 annually. A retired U.S. Army Lieutenant Colonel with more than 21 years of active duty service, he also served as Director of Development for Hospice of Volusia/Flagler, Executive Director for the Alumni Association at Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University (ERAU), and Director of Development for Athletics at ERAU. He earned his Bachelor of Arts degree from Mercer University and his Master of Aeronautical Science degree from Embry-Riddle University.



The primary purpose of the office of president is to provide both spiritual and overall institutional leadership for achievement of the school's mission. The president will lead others to ensure the Catholic identity of the school as articulated by the Diocese of Orlando. The president is directly accountable for the business and financial affairs of Father Lopez Catholic High School including long range strategic planning, support of educational and financial planning, Catholic identity, admissions, fundraising, marketing and public relations, alumni relations, management and facilities. He will work directly with the board of trustees to enhance the institutional advancement activities for the school to establish its long-term viability.



Mr. Petrucciani, returning to his high school alma mater ('64), is well known in Volusia County for his leadership abilities having served as an educational professional for more than four decades. He has had a positive impact on thousands of Volusia County students in the classroom, on the athletic fields and as an administrator, beginning as a teacher at New Smyrna Beach High School. His service extended to seven other schools during his career, including Father Lopez High School. In 2008 he was recognized as Volusia County PTA Principal of the Year and State Principal of the Year. He will vacate the principal's position at David C. Hinson, Sr. Middle School.

"This team's leadership capabilities qualified them both as top candidates for each position," said Dr. Nicholas Wolsonovich, Superintendent of Schools for the Diocese of Orlando. "Their breadth of experience will create a seamless transition. The team's abilities will energize the on-going work of this new school."

Father Lopez Catholic High School is a Christ-centered community of learners. Its curriculum promotes spiritual formation in the Catholic Tradition and academic rigor to create a positive culture where all students are free to discover their full human potential through scholarly pursuits, athletics, and service leadership. Its enrollment for the 2009-2010 school year is 323 students.
